I can comfortably say that I am likely among the world's greatest procrastinators. While this title mostly aplies to my life as a college student, I find that I procrastinate in other areas as well, and in these cases, where there often is no deadline, the procrastination can go on for a lifetime. All of this, in turn, strengthens my faith life.

Education and Youth

--Youth Group—We continue to meet with the Methodist, Presbyterian and Episcopalian youth from the area. In the fall we met at Trinity and now in the spring we meet at the Methodist church.

High school youth will be led on a mission trip June 11-17. by Richard Brown. There are 5 students signed up and we have space for 5 more.

Another youth opportunity is a summer pack trip for youth June 12-15 led by Pastor Pat at the Presbyterian church. Youth ages 12 or older. Cost is \$160.00 per participant.

--Faith Formation continues with 12 students regularly attending. I am reaching out for some help with this group; we have a large and active group of 7 boys and 5 girls, from grade 1-5. Two adults is not quite enough. Lynette Kyle volunteered to come some weeks so I will be seeking one more to be there the weeks she is not. Patty is working with the students on singing and we hope to share music with the congregation again.

--VBS—Planning for VBS with the Powell churches has begun. We will collaborate with them again this summer. Since the newest version of the Little Mermaid is coming out, the theme will be an under the sea theme, "Part of God's World!" Dates are June 12th-16th.

I am starting a long term continuing education class on facilitating change in churches. I just became aware of this class and have to catch up to be part of the next unit that begins in April. Pastors have two weeks which includes 2 Sundays of continuing education. I will be taking 2 days (March 23-24) during spring break for the class which is online. It will also require about one day a month for the foreseeable future.

Drew will be gone several hours on April 3rd & 4th. When this happened in March, it did not interrupt the functioning in the church office.

Consideration and Approval of Feb 2023 Minutes: Melissa Kraft submitted updated Balance Sheet, Transactions by Account, and Profit and Loss (P&L) Budget Sheets. Melissa discussed assembling an easier way to understand the budget/financial reports. The current program utilized is Quick Books. It was noted the average tithing in the beginning of the year is usually inflated and these numbers typically do not carry throughout the year.
